

Most Rev. Mark A. Pivarunas, CMRI: His Excellency, Bishop Pivarunas, was ordained in 1985 and, six years later, raised to the episcopacy by the late Bishop Moises Carmona. Bishop Pivarunas is the superior general of the Congregation of Mary Immaculate Queen, pastor of Mary Immaculate Church in Omaha, rector of Mater Dei Seminary, and principal of Mater Dei Academy. His



Excellency also founded the Congregation of Sisters of the Mother of God to assist in his work for souls. Bishop Pivarunas is a regular speaker at our annual Fatima Conference, discussing current affairs of the Church in these times of apostasy.

Rev. Fr. Casimir Puskorius, CMRI: Ordained by Bishop George Musey in 1986, Fr. Casimir served in several parishes before taking up residence at Mount St. Michael in 2001. Since then, he has served as pastor of “the Mount,” our largest parish. In addition to his many duties as pastor, Father also teaches at St. Michael’s Academy. Fr. Casimir is also an accom-



plished pianist and enjoys playing the organ for various ceremonies, sometimes joining with the choir to sing when he is not himself offering the Mass. Father regularly speaks at the Fatima Conference, particularly on theological topics of interest to Catholics in our times.

Rev. Fr. Dominic Radecki, CMRI: Fr. Dominic and his twin brother were ordained by Bishop Robert McKenna in 1988. Father is pastor of Queen of Angels Church in Santa Clarita, California, and of Immaculate Heart of Mary Church in Rosamond. He also serves as general treasurer of the religious congregation and is the director of Mary Immaculate Queen



Rev. Fr. Benedict Hughes, CMRI: Over the years as a priest and religious, Fr. Benedict has spent his life in various works in the service of Our Blessed Mother, particularly in the field of education. Having taught for some years in our school at Mount St. Michael and in the major seminary, Father eventually began the work of our minor seminary in 1999.



Father is the pastor of Mary Immaculate Queen Church in nearby Rathdrum, Idaho. He is also the editor of *The Reign of Mary*, the official magazine of the Congregation of Mary Immaculate Queen.

Rev. Fr. James McGilloway: Fr. James is the oldest of the CMRI priests and has been a member of the Congregation for 51 years. He has labored for souls at parishes in Ohio and Michigan, as well as here at Mount St. Michael, where he currently resides. Fr. James will be the Keynote Speaker at this year’s Fatima Conference.



Rev. Father Francisco Radecki, CMRI: Along with his twin brother, Fr. Francisco was ordained by Bishop Robert McKenna in 1988. Father is pastor of St. Joseph’s Church in Detroit, Michigan. He has authored two Latin primers, two catechisms, and has co-authored with Fr. Dominic Radecki three books on Vatican II and its aftermath, which have benefited numerous souls seeking answers to the dilemmas of our day.



Rev. Fr. Michael Anaya: An alumnus of St. Michael’s Academy, Fr. Anaya was ordained by His Excellency, Bishop Pivarunas, in 1997. Since then, he has served in various parishes of our religious congregation, eventually becoming pastor of St. Mary’s Church in Tacoma, Washington. In addition to his pastoral duties in Tacoma, Father travels regularly to Spokane to teach theology and choir to the high school students here at St. Michael’s Academy. In addition to speaking at the annual Fatima Conference, Fr. Anaya is the Conference emcee, keeping everything running smoothly and on time.



Mr. Mario Derksen, M.A., a native of Germany, is a convert to sedevacantism (2003). A student of classical Thomistic philosophy, Mr. Derksen has a specialized interest in refuting the errors of modern philosophy. He holds a B.A. in philosophy from Florida Atlantic University (2000) and an M.A. in philosophy from Holy Apostles College & Seminary (2004). His master’s thesis, *Against the Sceptics: How Thomist Realism Refutes Radical Scepticism*, takes to task some of the most fundamental errors in modern philosophy. Mr. Derksen will be giving the Friday night dinner lecture on *The False Popes*.
